## ABOUT THIS REPORT

---

This report is based on data from the **NATIONAL INCIDENT BASED REPORTING SYSTEM (NIBRS)**, a system used by local, county, and state law enforcement agencies to track crimes. Agencies can submit their data using the state's web-based system or their own records management systems, with all information collected by the South Dakota Division of Criminal Investigation's Statistical Analysis Center. The Statistical Analysis Center then forwards the data to the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), which uses it to produce national crime reports such as *Crime in the United States*.



The data in this report is updated throughout the year and can also be accessed at any time on the Attorney General's NIBRS website by visiting **[sdcrime.nibrs.com](https://sdcrime.nibrs.com)**.

### Readers should take the following factors into account when interpreting this data:

- Indian Reservations are not included in this report because they report crime data directly to the FBI.
- Comparing data from year to year can provide insight into crime trends, but the number of reporting agencies may vary annually.
- Figures in this report may differ from FBI national reports, which estimate unreported data and follow strict submission deadlines.

Since 2008, South Dakota's Statistical Analysis Center has accepted only NIBRS data. Unlike older reporting systems that collected totals for a few crime types, NIBRS records each individual incident and arrest. It includes 24 crime categories (53 specific crimes) called Group A offenses, and 10 Group B offense categories, for which only arrest data are collected.

A key feature of NIBRS is that all crimes occurring in a single incident are reported, rather than only the most serious crime.

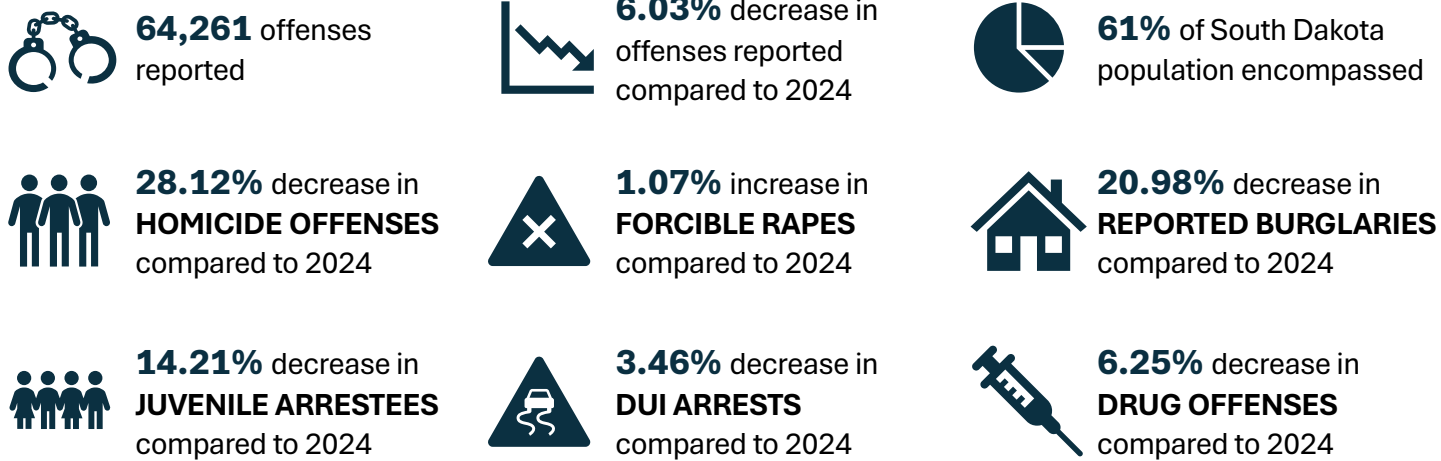
The report also includes information on law enforcement employees, counting the number of full-time officers and civilian staff employed by active agencies as of October 31 each year.

NIBRS data are continually updated as agencies provide new information. This report summarizes data for a twelve-month period from January 1 to December 31. The accuracy of the report depends on the data submitted by each reporting agency.

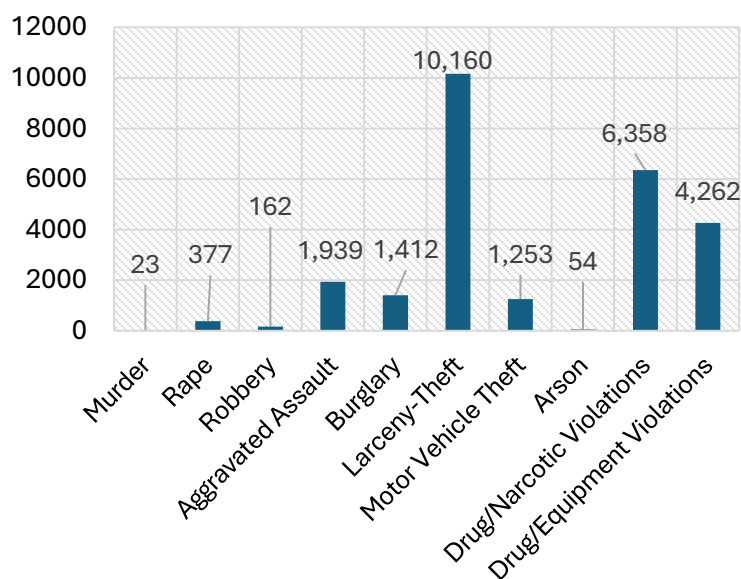
## PROFILE OF REPORTED CRIMES

The following table is a profile of reported crimes for 2025 in South Dakota. This table includes calculated crime rates per 100,000 people. The use of crime rates in making comparisons in crime trends helps to minimize problems with crime data interpretation. However, readers are cautioned that crime rates cited are reliable indications of crime only to the extent that population estimates are accurate, that victims report crimes and NIBRS data is submitted to the Division of Criminal Investigation’s Statistical Analysis Center by South Dakota law enforcement agencies.

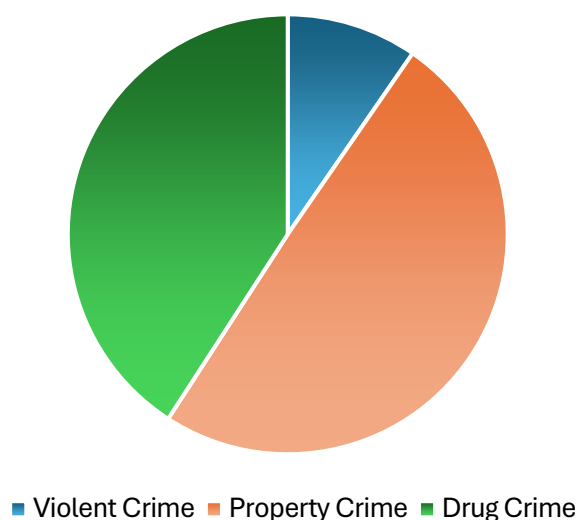

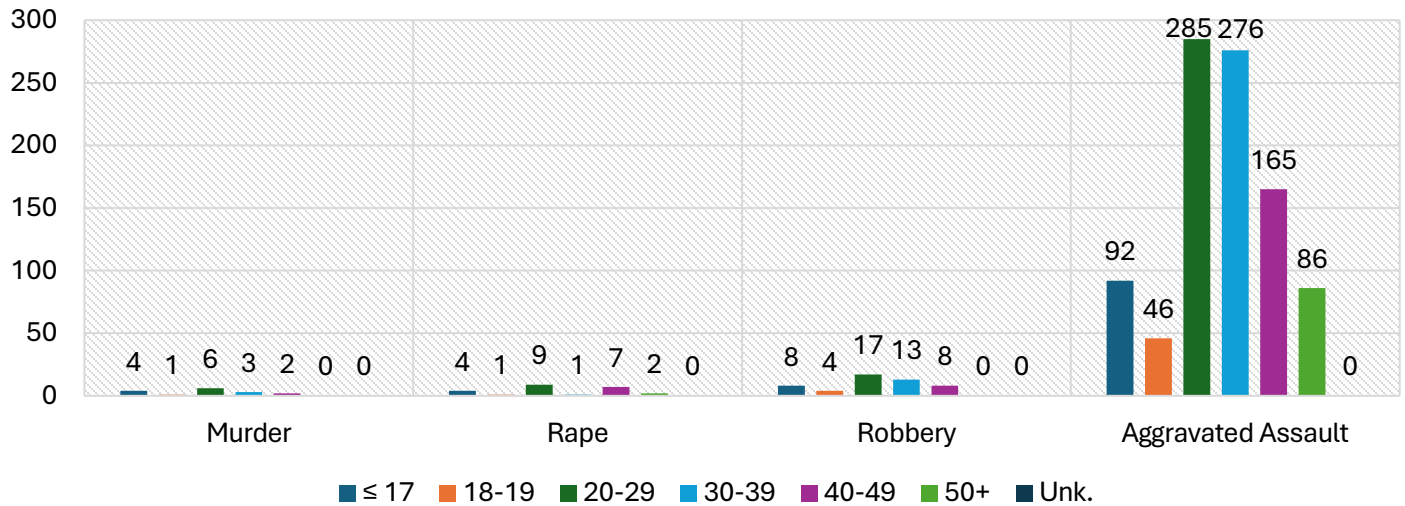

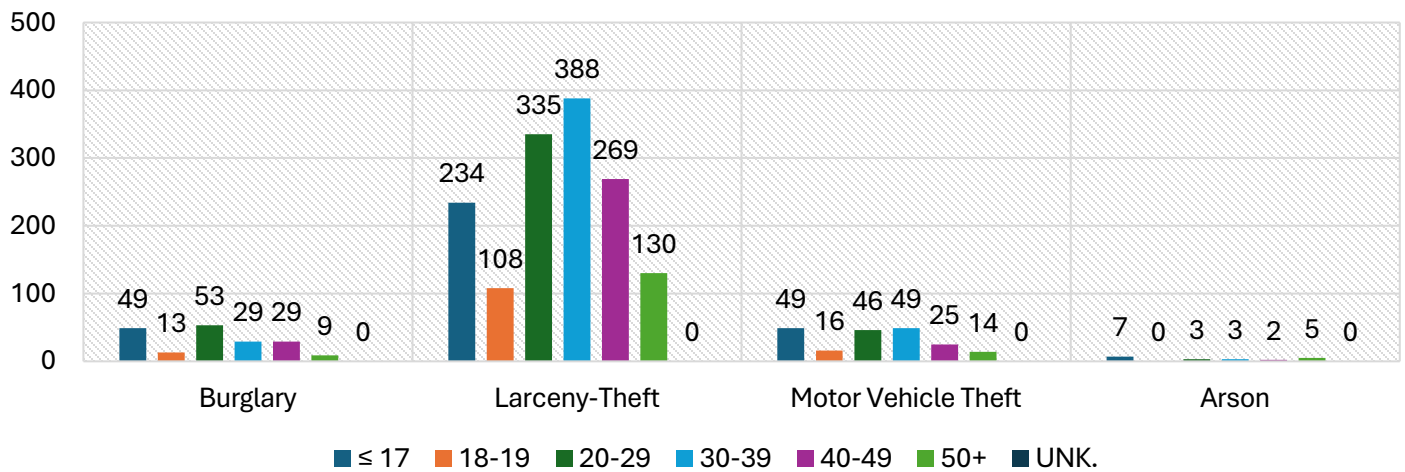

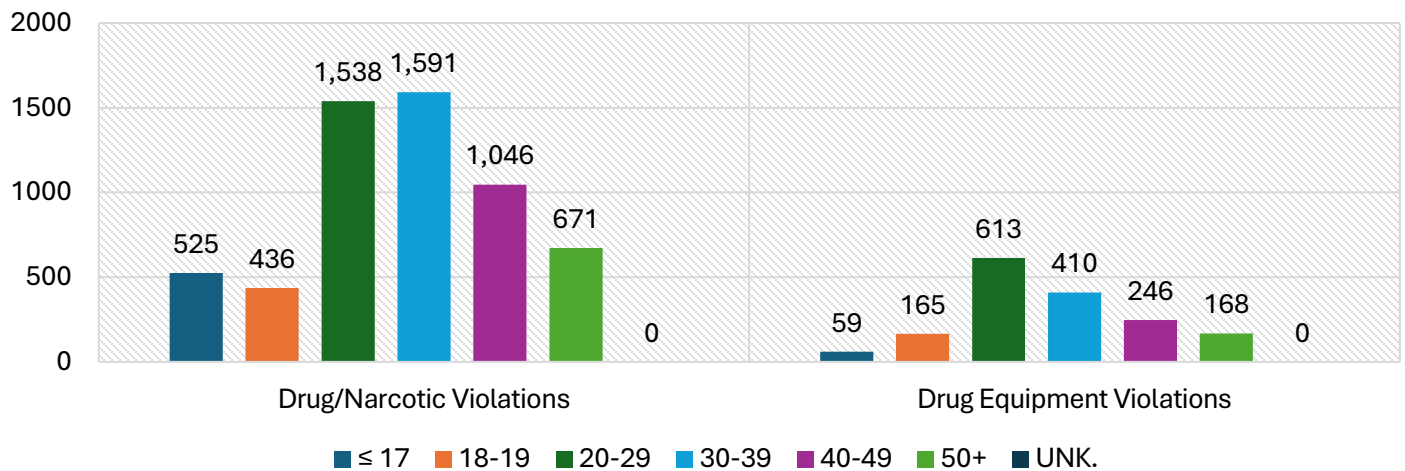
## VIOLENT CRIME ARRESTEE BY AGE

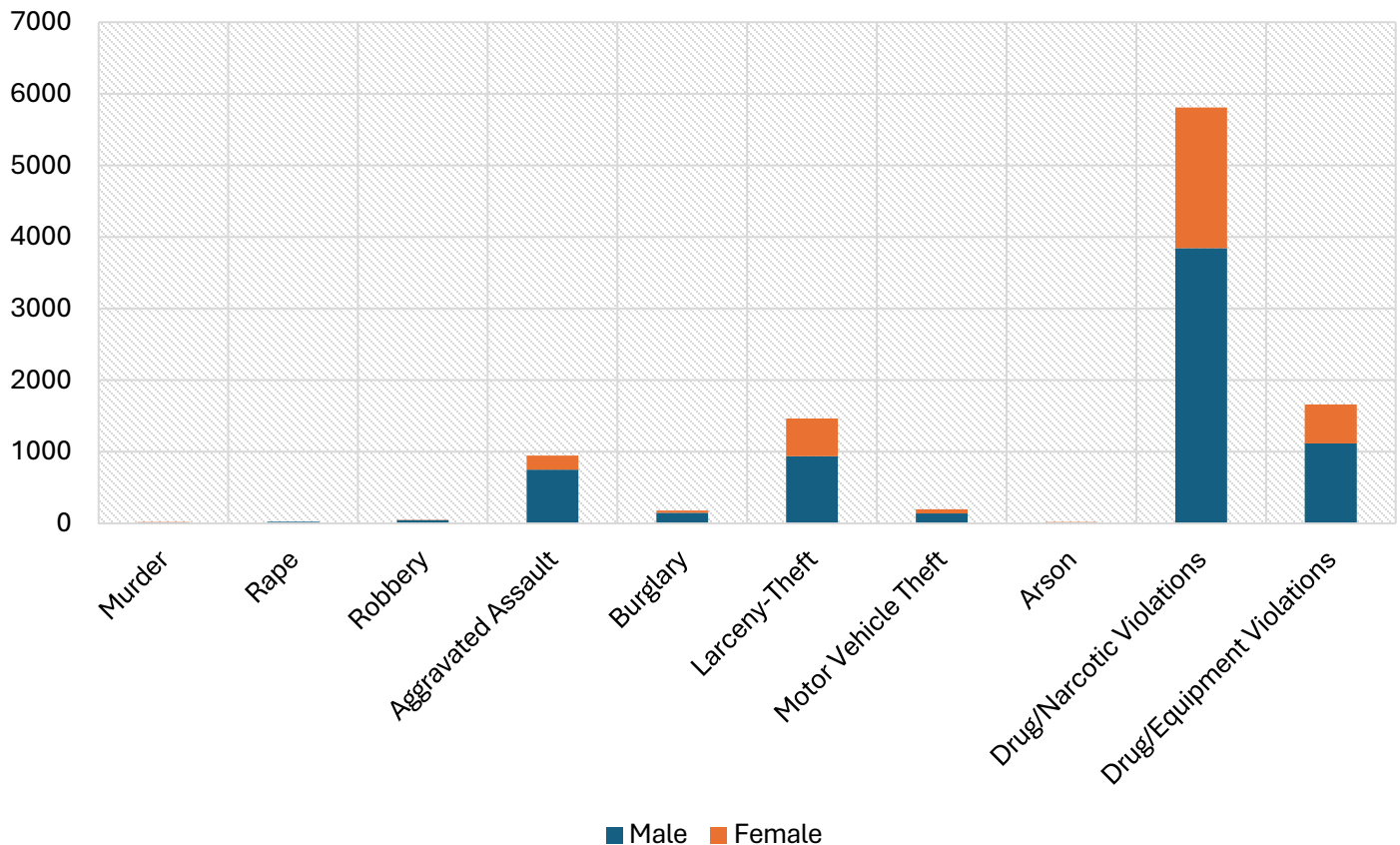

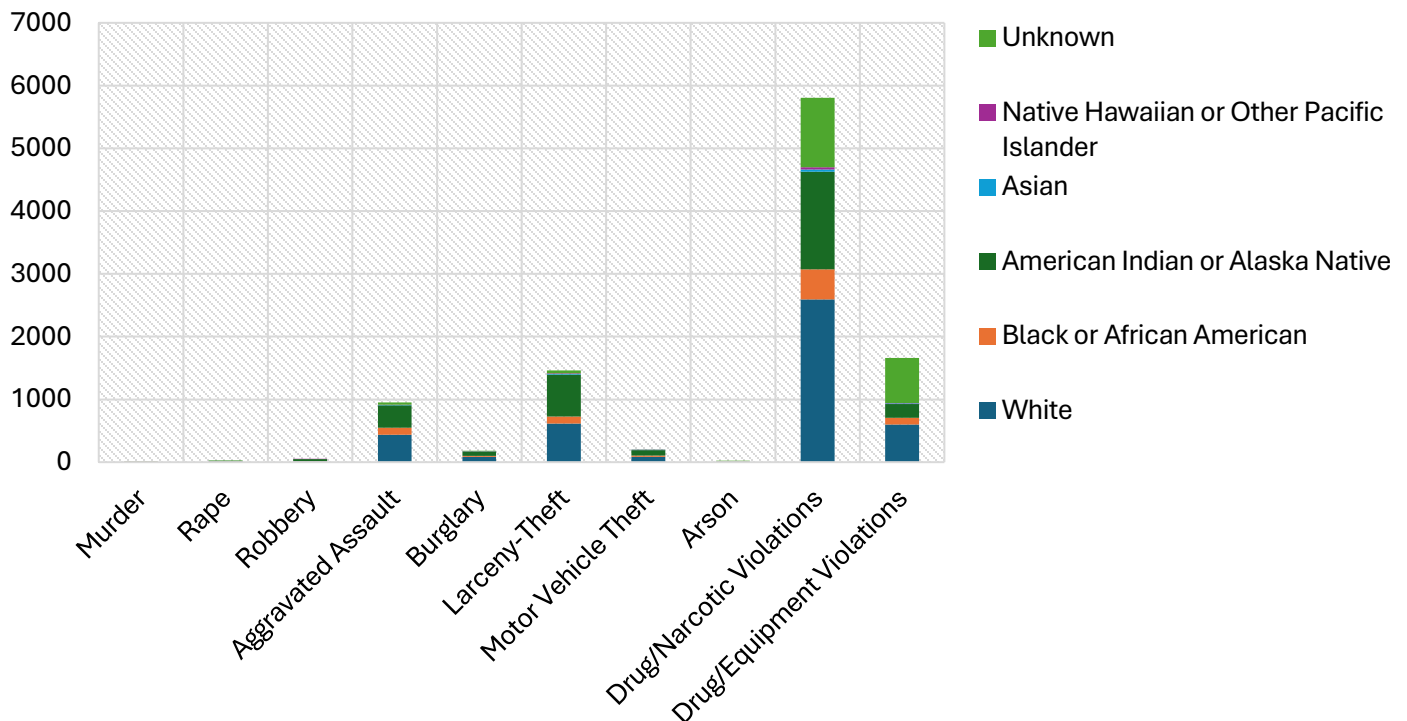

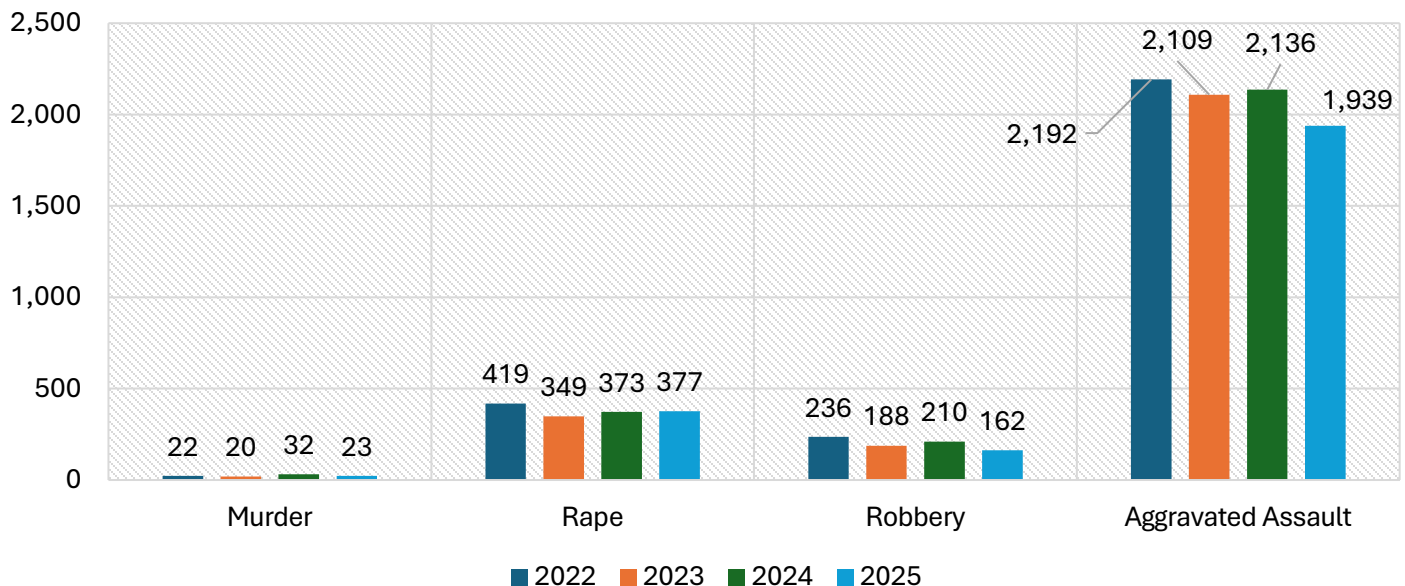

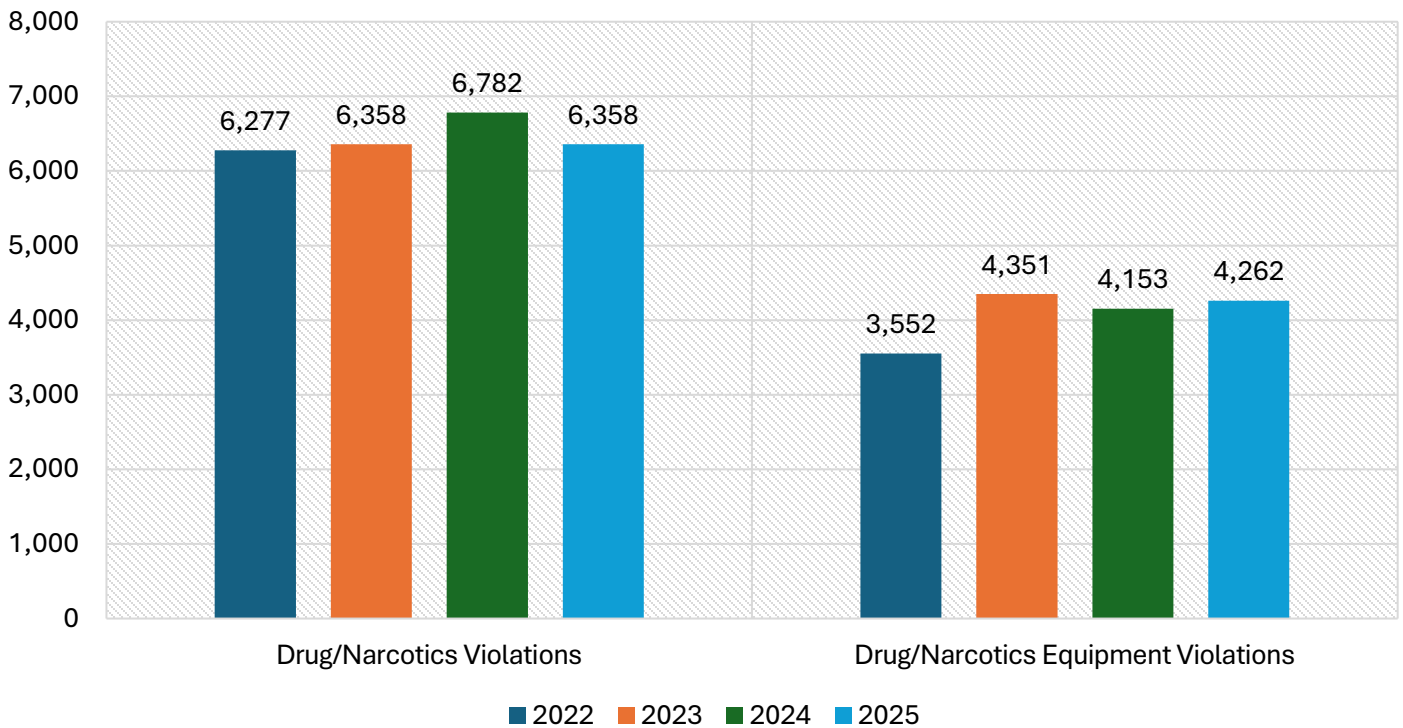
### COMPARISON OF VIOLENT CRIME INCIDENTS



## COMPARISON OF PROPERTY CRIME INCIDENTS

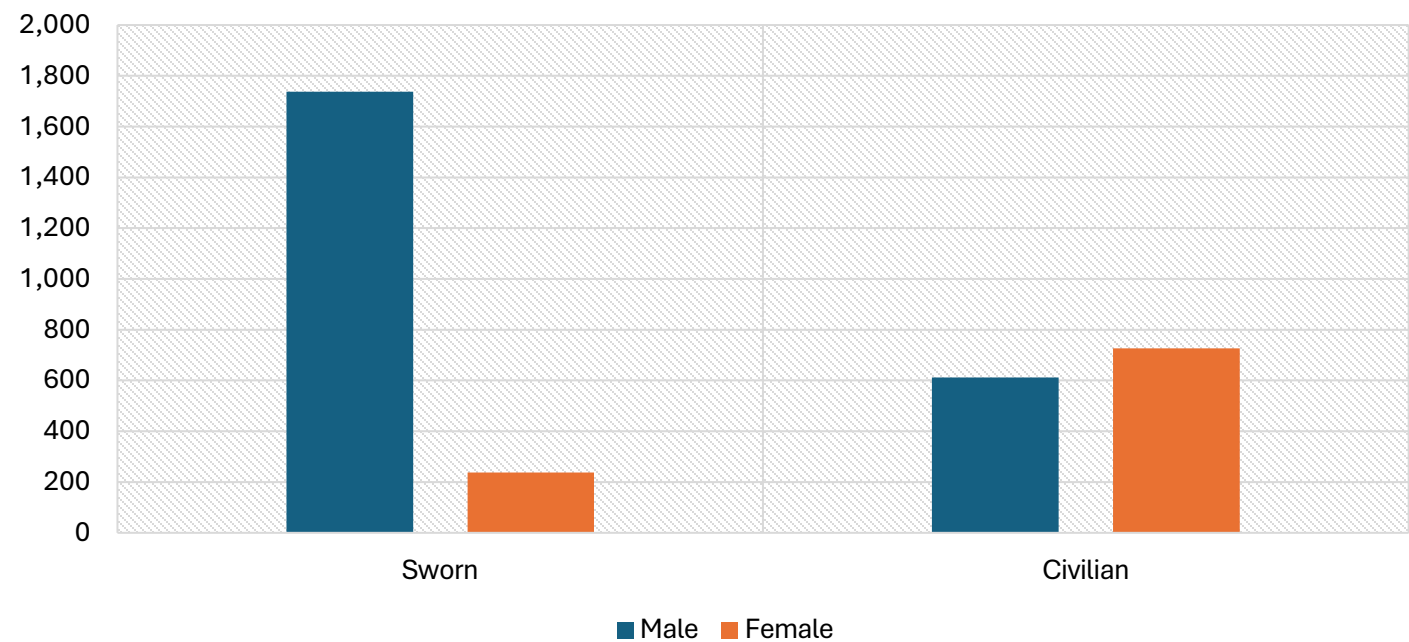


## COMPARISON OF DRUG CRIME INCIDENTS

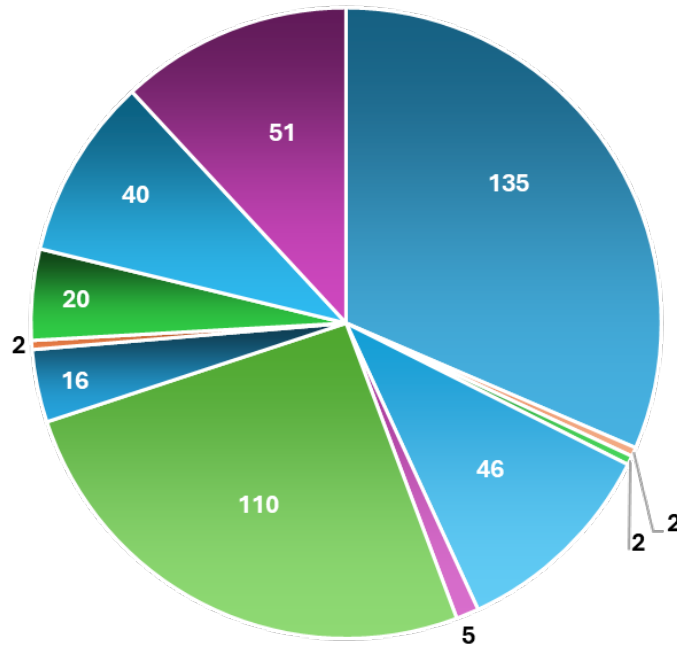

OFFENSE CODES AND DESCRIPTIONS

This section explains how crimes reported by law enforcement are categorized using the National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS). Each type of offense is assigned a specific code and grouped into categories such as crimes against persons (like assault or homicide), crimes against property (such as burglary or theft), and crimes against society (including drug or weapon violations).

NIBRS divides offenses into two main groups: **GROUP A**, which includes detailed reporting on 53 serious crimes like murder, robbery, and drug violations, and **GROUP B**, which covers 10 less severe offenses where only arrest data is collected, such as disorderly conduct or DUI. Understanding these codes helps readers interpret the data accurately and see how different types of crime contribute to overall trends.
